Vigil: Arise, Jerusalem, and look to the East, and see your children gathered from the rising to the setting of the sun.

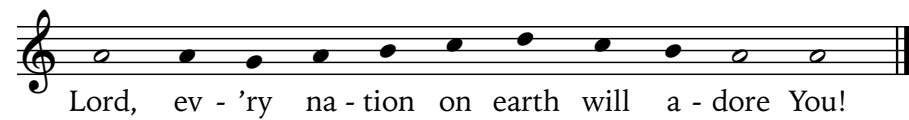
Mass During the Day: Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kinship is in His grasp, and power and dominion.
