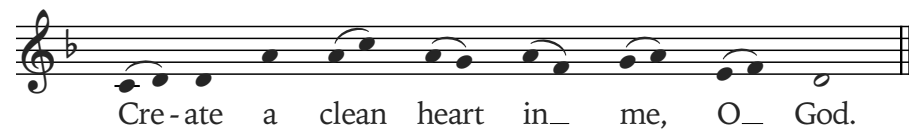

Psalm

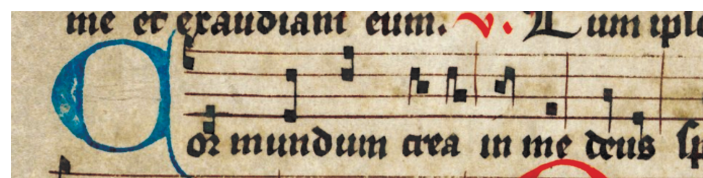
Ps 51:3-4, 12-13, 14-15

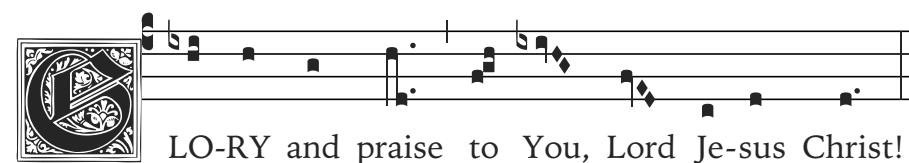
A clean heart create for me, O God, and a steadfast spirit renew within me. Cast me not out from your presence, and your Holy Spirit take not from me.
