

"For Sundays of Advent & Lent"









Q: Why do we sing chant at Mass? **A:** The Second Vatican Council taught the following in its constitution on the sacred liturgy, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*:

- 36. Particular law remaining in force, the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites.
- 54. Steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them.
- 116. The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services.

believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.




